Housing Discrimination Based on Sex/Gender Is Illegal

The federal Fair Housing Act makes it unlawful to discriminate in the rental or sale of housing on the basis of sex.

This can look like...

- Threatening a transgender person in transition with eviction if they dress or present in gender-affirming ways.
- Telling a woman she needs a male co-signer even though she qualifies on her own.



 A landlord insists on doing "random check-ins" only for female tenants.

- Refusing to rent or sell a home to someone based on their gender
 - A landlord refusing to rent to a queer couple because it's against their religion

Violence Against Women Act

VAWA is a federal law that protects people in federally funded housing who have experienced domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking.

VAWA provides additional protections for a person who has a domestic violence survivor status or is experiencing intimate partner violence, so they don't have to choose between safety and their home.



Sexual Harassment Violates Fair Housing Law

Sexual harassment is a form of gender discrimination What this can look like..

- A landlord tells an applicant they won't rent to her unless she performs a sexual act continually.
- A property manager who makes unwelcome, suggestive comments about a tenant's body

Property owners are responsible if any employee, site manager, or maintenance worker is sexually harassing a tenant.
